



This, incredibly, is the eighth year in a row that Eurowines has won it! Yes, Italy is its speciality, but it's one it does really well. Despite being a relatively small merchant, it had more medals from Italy than anybody else, which shows there's some top-class selection - both of estates and wines - going on. It's strongest in the North - over half its medals came from the North-East or North-West - but it seems to find interesting examples from the centre and South, too. Only Tuscany - on this year's evidence - seems to be rather quiet. As impressive as the number of medals this year was the pricing. Half of its medals and all but two of its Golds were under £15, which is a better performance than last year."



Alto Adige

Alto Adige could be described as one of the least known but most notable wine regions of Italy. Located at the very top of the country bordering Austria, the 'U' shaped glacial valley has distinct Germanic and Austrian influences. As a gateway to Italy. Alto Adige was an important area for the Romans, the Austro-Hungarian Empire and only became part of Italy in 1919. There are three official languages; Italian, German and Ladin.

Due to its geographical nature, the vineyards in Alto Adige tend to be situated on steep slopes. Indeed the area is so mountainous only 15% of the region is suitable for cultivation (around 13,000 hectares). The unique location does however, allow white varietals to flourish - the Pinot Grigio is possibly among the best in the world, easily competing with Austrian Grüner Veltliner and German Riesling.

The climate and position also permits the growth of grape varieties not usually seen in other parts of Italy; Müller Thurgau, Gewürztraminer, Riesling, Sylvaner, Schiava, Teroldego and Lagrein, an ancient varietal that dates back to the 1500's. Soil composition in the region ranges from rocky minerals to volcanic deposits and slate.



San Michele Appiano



Established in 1907, the San Michele Appiano winery is today considered to be one of the best wineries in Alto Adige and Italy. It presently has 320 members, 385 hectares of vineyard and produces 2.5 million bottles every year.

The winery is in the fortunate position to have at its disposal some of the best vineyards in and around Appiano and along the Alto Adige Wine Road.

The Sanct Valentin range is the cru line of San Michele Appiano. The vines are between 20 and 40 years old and are in the heart of the traditional Eppan white wine area. These vineyards are at an altitude of between 400 and 620 metres above sea level with a South to South-eastern exposure.

In 2024 Jakob Gasser was appointed winemaker at St. Michael Eppan Winery. Jakob's respect for tradition and focus on sustainability represents the synthesis of innovation, tradition and respect for nature that will shape the future of St Michael Eppan.



Veneto

Located in north-eastern Italy, Veneto is among the largest wine-producing regions, both for DOC and IGT wines. It made Italian wine popular around the world with its Valpolicella, Soave, Amarone and Prosecco. The importance of winemaking in this region is emphasised by the creation of the very first Italian school for vine growing and oenology dating back to 1885. In addition, Veneto was the first region to constitute a "strada del vino", or "wine road." This first wine-touring road featured special road signs providing information on vines and the wines they were made into, and joined the Valdobbiadene and Conegliano DOC zones crossing a series of hilly vineyards.

The Po Valley covers 57% of Veneto. This valley consists of a plain extending from the mountains to the Adriatic Sea, the lower section being a mainstay of agricultural production. The rich soil in this region is full of silt and sand, with clay and calcareous debris. Veneto is protected from the harsh northern European climate by the Alps, the foothills of which form the region's northern extremes. These cooler climates are well-suited to white varieties like Garganega while the warmer Adriatic coastal plains and river valleys are where the renowned Valpolicella, Amarone and Bardolino DOC reds are produced.

Veneto's growers are among the most modernised in Italy. While most of the classic wines from this region are based on native grape varieties like Glera and Verduzzo, high demand for Veneto wines in the European and US markets has prompted the region's producers to experiment with Cabernet, Chardonnay and Pinot varieties.

Zenato



In the heart of the Lugana area on the southern shores of Lake Garda, the Zenato winery was established in 1960, when the late Sergio Zenato and his wife Carla started to create quality wines from the local grape variety Trebbiano di Lugana. The Zenato winery now owns 100 hectares in total, 65 in San Benedetto di Lugana and 35 hectares in Sant'Ambrogio, in the Valpolicella Classico area.

The Zenato name is synonymous with Amarone and they have continously produced Amarone and Amarone Riserva of immense complexity and depth, to international acclaim.

As well as Amarone, Zenato produce other wines typical of the region such as Valpolicella and Bardolino.

Along with outstanding red wines, Zenato also produce white wines that are renowned for their clean and elegant fruit character.

Over the years, Zenato has become one of the most respected family owned wineries in Italy. Following in the footsteps of their late father, today Nadia and Alberto form a well-balanced partnership, using their talent and passion to continue Zenato's viticultural heritage.

Sansonina




Sansonina is a large 18th century estate in the Sirmione area, renowned for the production of Lugana, one of the most famous white wines of the Lombardy and Veneto region. Uniquely, the estate has the areas only established Merlot vines.

It was for this reason that in the mid 1990s, Carla Prospero acquired Sansonina with the express purpose of taking on the challenge of producing a great red wine in a zone traditionally known for its whites, the result was the magnificent 'Sansonina Merlot IGT'.

Since then Carla and her daughter Nadia Zenato have grown the range which now includes a second red wine 'Evaluna' and a second, spontaneously fermented, Lugana produced from the oldest Lugana vineyard, Moraro Verde.

The name Sansonina derives from the legend of 'Samson'. Local folklore has it that the Estate was once owned by a lady nicknamed 'Little Samson' known for her strong character.


Campagnola



Situated in Valgatara, the centre of the Valpolicella production zone, the Campagnola winery was founded in 1907 by Giuseppe Campagnola, who initiated a tradition of excellent value and quality which is flourishing to this day.

The founder's grandson and namesake, Giuseppe now runs the recently renovated winery along with his sons Andrea and Paolo. Together, they have created a portfolio of wines not only from the Veneto but from regions as far afield as Puglia.

Despite already producing an excellent Amarone, Giuseppe decided to push the boundaries further and make a Cru of truly exceptional quality. This culminated in an Amarone of immense character and depth, which he named Caterina Zardini in honour of his late grandmother. This wine, along with its baby sister 'Caterina Zardini Valpolicella DOC Classico Superiore', has firmly established itself as the jewel in the Campagnola portfolio and is consistently internationally awarded for quality and character.

Cantina di Custoza



Cantina di Custoza was founded in 1968 by 83 winegrowers and today has 227 members who contribute grapes from over 1,000 hectares of south-facing vineyards that are located on the hills and foothills south and southwest of Lake Garda.

The terrains are glacial moraines composed primarily of limestone, gravel and sand. The climate is mild and temperate.

The fresh and fruity 'Classica' range offers great 'food' wines, whilst the newly packaged 'Val dei Molini' range takes its name from one of the most charming valleys in the Veneto and is part of the Cantina's ongoing 'quality project'. The range is completed with the premium 'Custodia' selection: the name comes from Custoza's ancient name as custodian of the territory.

The Villa Domiziano Prosecco Spumante is made with grapes hand harvested from the hillside regions in the Veneto area. The winery is very modern using state of the art technology to ensure all aspects of high quality in the production process. The Prosecco is made from the Glera grape and is known for its well balanced fresh citrus and apple flavours, with delicious lightness and good length on the finish.





Ardesia wines are an exciting collaboration with producers based in the hillsides of the Veneto region, and the wines from this estate are all made from carefully harvested grapes with great care taken in the vineyards to ensure only the finest quality fruit is used. The Sauvignon Blanc del Veneto IGT & Merlot del Veneto IGT are aromatic with strong fruit notes and well balanced on the palate.





Cantina Colli di Soligo



Located midway between Conegliano and Valdobbiadene, the Cantina Colli del Soligo was formed in 1957 by a group of local vine growers who were united by their love for Prosecco and their land. Soligo's vineyards are located on the gentle slopes which were once glacial sea beds, rich in sediment minerals from the glaciers melting away.

This ideal location between the sea and the Alps has a temperate climate, perfect for enhancing primary aromas in grapes.

The co-operative now has a total of 600 partners and produces 15,000 tons of grapes a year.

All Soligo wines have a very distinctive personality, particularly the Spumantes.



Located at the most north-eastern point of Italy, Friuli-Venezia Giulia is an autonomous region with a rich history given its geographic, ethnic, and cultural location as a frontier hub between central Europe to the north, the Slavic regions to the east, and the Italian Peninsula to the west and south. The winemaking history of the Friuli-Venezia Giulia has been strongly influenced by the history of the Friuli and Venezia Giulia regions, which were important stops along the Mediterranean spice route from the Byzantine Empire to the trading centre of Venice.

Friuli-Venezia Giulia is very mountainous in the north, and gives way to flatter terrain and plains near the sea. The climate is distinguished by warm days and chilly nights which help to maintain a balance in grape acidity and sugar levels, allowing the grapes a long, slow growing season. Harvest normally takes place in September. The soils of the region vary from the calcium rich sandstone in the more hilly regions to clay, sand, and gravel in the valley.

Most of the vineyards of Friuli-Venezia Giulia are located in the southern half of the region, including the large wine regions of Collio Goriziano, Colli Orientali del Friuli, Isonzo and Carso. The Lison-Pramaggiore region is shared with Veneto. Smaller regions such as the Annia, Aquileia, Grave and Latisana are located in the central and western part of the region around the city of Pordenone. These smaller regions are located on alluvial plains with soils composed of gravel and sand. Drawing from native grape varieties as well as the international array, Friulians have applied studied vineyard techniques and avant-garde oenology to the production of highly distinctive whites, as well as some attractive reds. Though wine production represents only 2% of the Italian output, the white wines from Collio are considered amongst the best in Italy.



Livon



Situated in San Giovanni al Natisone, the Livon winery was established in 1964 when Dorino Livon purchased his first piece of land in the Collio.

With a philosophy of 'Quality above all else', he began to make wine that truly reflected the diversity of the region's grape varieties and

Dorino's sons, Valneo and Tonino, joined their father in the late 1980's and through continuous acquisition, have transformed Livon into the largest family owned winery in Collio. The third generation of the Livon family are now joining their fathers ensuring the future of the company is in safe hands.

Today the estate comprises 263 hectares and 2 wineries located in Masarotte and Venco. Each winery is equipped with the most modern winemaking facilities and barrique ageing cellars thus allowing the winemakers to express the surrounding vineyard's individual characteristics to the full.

The Livon family celebrated their 50th Anniversary by launching the 'Selezioni 50 Annivewrsaio, Collio DOC' in 2014. A blend of the two ancient, indigenous grape varieties, Friulano and Ribolla Gialla, representing the very best of the Collio region.

DOC Friuli Grave

Between the provinces of Pordenone and Udine, straddling the Tagliamento river extends a natural landscape of striking originality: the "grave", generated by the large alluvial fans of the rivers Meduna, Cellina, and Tagliamento. In the northern part, they are characterized by a coarse terrain, which along the coast line becomes fine.











Lombardy

The winemaking tradition of Lombardy dates back to its settlement by Greeks from Athens along the Po River. Today, Lombardy is considered the industrial and commercial capital of Italy and the gateway to Europe. The region annually produces over 125 million litres of wine.

Lombardy is well-known for its sparkling wines made in the Franciacorta and Oltrepò Pavese areas. The Valtellina zone produces many notable wines using a local version of the Nebbiolo variety. The stony soil composition of the region helps to retain heat that is released during the evening to warm the vines.

While the weather of Lombardy is varied, the region is generally considered a cool continental climate and is influenced by several geographic features that control the temperature and terroir of the land. These include the Alps located in the northern parts of the region near the wine producing area of Valtellina and the Po River, which runs along the Oltrepò Pavese and forms most of the region's southern border with Emilia-Romagna. Many wine areas are located near some of Lombardy's major lakes, including Franciacorta near Lake Iseo as well as the Garda Bresciano and Garda Mantovano regions near Lake Garda. To the west of Lombardy is the Piedmont wine region, to the south is Emilia-Romagna and to the east are the Trentino-Alto Adige/Südtirol and Veneto wine regions.



Piedmont

One of the most famous wine regions of Italy, Piedmont's name translates to "at the foot of the Mountain", and the stunning views are adequately matched by the wines and food of the region.

Located in the foothills of the Alps, Piedmont forms its border with France and Switzerland. In addition to its mountainous terrain, the Po Valley also consumes a large area of Piedmont, leaving only 30% of the region suitable for vineyard plantings. The valley and mountains both contribute to the area's noted fog cover that aides in the ripening of the Nebbiolo grape (which gets its name from the Piedmontese word "nebbia" meaning "fog").

The Piedmont wine region has a colder, continental winter climate and significantly lower rainfall due to the rain shadow effect of the Alps. Soil in the region is primarily clay based with calcium and mineral deposits. Vineyards are typically planted on hillsides at altitudes between 150-400 metres. The warmer, south facing slopes are primarily used for Nebbiolo or Barbera whilst the cooler sites are planted with Dolcetto or Moscato.

Over the last 20 years winemaking has concentrated predominantly on quality against quantity (from 92,000 hectares to 52,000 hectares of vineyards), and on local grape varieties. Today Piedmont includes 17 DOCG zones and an impressive total of 42 DOC zones.



Cordero di Montezemolo



The Cordero di Montezemolo estate lies in the heart of the Langhe district of Alba.

The Montezemolos are descendants of the Falletti family whose lineage and presence in Monfalletto can be traced back to medieval times.

The majority of the family's vineyards are located in the Annunziata district near the town of La Morra which is the most famous of the eleven communes that collectively form the Barolo wine zone.

The Estate is dominated by an ancient Cedar of Lebanon tree which rests at the top of the hill overlooking the vineyards, a view now enjoyed from the ultra-modern tasting room.

By no means traditionalists, the Montezemolo family produce intensely powerful wines to international acclaim. The wines regularly score highly in publications such as Wine Spectator, who included no less than three Montezemolo wines in their Top 100 Wines of 2014.

The impressive expansion over the last few years of both the barrique cellar and state-of-the-art tasting room has been coupled with the adoption of low environmental impact practices throughout the vineyards. In 2013, the family began the process for organic certification.

Barolo Enrico VI originates from an exceptional and unique vineyard considered to be amongst the best for the appellation, occupying an area of two hectares at 300 metres in the municipality of Castiglione Falletto. This vineyard which is set in iron rich soil with vines that are over 50 years old and exposed to the south west in a climate that is cooler and less ventilated. The Barolo Enrico VI displays a strong personality in the palate with earthiness and prominent mentholated notes, but at the same time an abundance of soft and sweet tannins.









Ca' del Baio



Located in the town of Treiso, in the province of Cuneo in the Langhe region, Ca' del Baio was founded in 1929 by Giuseppe Grasso and is today managed by his great-grandson Giulio, his wife Luciana and their three daughters Paola, Valentina and Federica. Ca' del Baio has 20 hectares of vineyards, located in Treiso and Barbaresco that are planted with Nebbiolo, Dolcetto, Barbera, Moscato and Chardonnay. The Nebbiolo, which is destined for the Barbaresco DOCG is divided into 3 crus (single vineyards bottling): Vallegrande, Asili and Pora. Vallegrande and Asili have the RISERVA version too with two more years of ageing.

Since 2014 they have started producing a "multi-cru" Barbaresco, collecting together the fruits of three Nebbiolo vineyards according to the Langa tradition. It is the Barbaresco Autinbej. The winery production philosophy is based on eco-sustainability and respect of each vine and plants and it adherates to the green experience certification and project : https://www.thegreenexperience.it/.

The wines of Ca' del Baio are born out of this close relationship. Over the years, Ca' del Baio has acquired a prominent position in the world of Barbaresco, once known simply as Barolo's 'Little Brother' but today gaining a worldwide appreciation and admiration. The family's reputation was recently raised even higher with Giulio awarded 'Viticulturist of the Year' at the Gambero Rosso, Vini d'Italia 2016.



Deltetto




The Deltetto family roots have been firmly grounded in Roero since the late 19th century. The current generation's grandfather Carlo Deltetto founded the winery at its present site in Canale in 1953 and the Deltetto's have been important protagonists in the birth of the Roero appellation, that recognizes the value of Arneis and Nebbiolo vines, in a terroir particularly suited to these varieties. Deltetto have also

been significant in developing the Favorita grape, making a delicately aromatic white, comparable to Vermentino from Liguria. The fossil drawings on the cru range of wines, symbolize the sandstone, sand and limestone soils rich in minerals and remnants of it marine origins. Deltetto are today forging the way forward in sparkling wine production and the Alta Langa DOC from the range is regarded as one of the best examples of this appellation.

With a rich history spanning four generations, the Berta family has been producing grappa since the beginning of the 20th century. The first distillery in Nizza Monferrato was constructed in 1947, and quickly became internationally renowned for the quality of its products.

The Berta family constantly strives for innovation in their distillery whilst maintaining the same spirit of quality. With years of intense work and research they have produced exceptional grappas, aged in the finest oak barrels and sold in beautifully designed bottles. Although their grappas are made following ancient traditions, they gave them a modern twist; rich in aromas, with softness and balsamic sensations on the palate.

As the business expanded, more space was needed and the Berta family moved back to where their great grandfather Francesco transformed the business, engaging in all aspects of the wine and grappa industry. The modern state-of-the-art Roccanivo distillery at Casalotto di Mombaruzzo opened in the grape harvest of 2002, a historic vintage for this family and the business.

Emilia Romagna

Emilia-Romagna, located in Northern Italy, is comprised of the former regions of Emilia and Romagna. Bologna, the region's capital, acts as a dividing line between the two regions. Emilia occupies the western sector, while Romagna lies to the east of Bologna and stretches all the way to the Adriatic Sea. Nearly half of the region (48%) consists of plains while 27% is hilly and 25% is mountainous. The soil in the region is made up of limestone, which allows the vines planted there to thrive. The wines of their neighbouring regions.

In Romagna, wine is made primarily from the Sangiovese, Trebbiano, and Albana grape varieties. Albana di Romagna was the first white wine to obtain the DOCG in 1987, and is usually dry and still with a distinctive almond undertone and finish. The best known grape of this area, however, is Sangiovese - a robust red with pronounced fruity flavours. It is becoming increasingly more popular for producers of Sangiovese to make superior reserve wines with greater depth of bouquet and flavour, capable of aging gracefully.

In Emilia the most famous wine is Lambrusco, a sparkling red grown in the DOC zones of Modena and Reggio Emilia, which in its authentic dry style is not often seen outside of Italy. Most exported Lambrusco is sweet, or 'amabile,' and often low in alcohol.

Emilia Romagna



Tuscany

Located in central Italy along the Tyrrhenian coast, Tuscany is home to some of the world's most renowned wine regions. With a rich history dating back to Etruscan times, wine making has been celebrated in local literature and art throughout all significant periods of the region.

Boasting hilly terrain and a warm, Mediterranean climate, Tuscany has ideal growing conditions for grapes, the most notable of which is the Sangiovese variety. Soil composition ranges from hard and stony, to rich in clay. The majority of the region's vineyards are found at altitudes of 150–500 metres, as the grapes perform better when they receive direct sunlight. The higher elevations also increase the daily temperature variation, helping the grapes maintain their balance of sugars and acidity as well as their aromatic qualities.

Tuscany has many notable wines, the most famous being Brunello di Montalcino, Vino Nobile di Montepulciano, Carmignano, and of course Chianti and Chianti Classico. In the 1970s, high quality wines made outside of DOC/DOCG regulations called "Super Tuscans" emerged. These wines commanded high prices and have since become world-renowned. As the trend of creating high quality non-DOC wines spread to other regions of Italy, the classification system was modified in order to include Super Tuscans as DOC/DOCG Chianti. Many producers have adopted these classifications, though some producers still prefer to use the less-restrictive IGT classification Toscana.



Camigliano



The village of Camigliano can trace its origins back to Etruscan times. It flourished during the Middle Ages with a local economy dedicated mainly to the cultivation of grapes and olives.

Walter Ghezzi bought the farm in 1957. The oldest vineyards date back to 1959 and the first vintage of Brunello was produced in 1965. Today, the estate extends to over 530 hectares, of which 92 are planted with vines. Of these, 50 hectares of vineyard to the south of Montalcino, are planted with the renowned Sangiovese Grosso, used to make Brunello and Brunello Riserva.

The hand harvested grapes are taken to a winery, where wine is designed to move by gravity, avoiding the damaging shock of mechanical pumps. The Ghezzi family care deeply about the environment, and have ensured the building of the modern winery was mostly underground, blending in with the beautiful countryside.

Tenuta Argentiera



The Tenuta Argentiera estate is situated on the coast of Tuscany between Livorno and Grosseto, about 100km south-west of Florence, on the southernmost border of the small but prestigious Bolgheri DOC zone.

Tenuta Argentiera is part of the former Tenuta di Donoratico estate which was once owned by the Serristori, an influential Florentine family who were given permanent use of this land by the Medici family in 1512. Today the estate is owned by Stanislaus Turnauer.

Within the Bolgheri DOC zone, the Tenuta Argentiera estate is the highest in altitude (150-200 metres) and has the closest proximity to the sea (2km). The soil composition in the vineyards is made up of clay and limestone at lower altitudes, and of clay and calcareous stones in the hilly, higher altitudes.

The quality of the Tenuta Argentiera wines is recognised not only in Italy but throughout the world. The wines regularly win Gold and Silver at the UK wine competitions and the US wine critics often award the Monovarietals 90+ points.

Badia di Morrona



The famous Tuscan grape variety Sangiovese has been cultivated in the stunning rolling countryside surrounding the village of Morrona since Etruscan times.

A tradition continued from 1000 AD by the Benedictine monks who produced wine at the Badia di Morrona (or the Abbey of Morrona) and revived by the Gaslini family who have devoted their care, attention and expertise to creating wines to express the unique terroir of Terricciola for three generations.

Acquiring the Abbey in 1939 in this historic area which lies roughly 30km south east of Pisa, today over half of the 110 hectares of vineyards are dedicated purely to the Sangiovese grape which, although difficult to grow, thrives in its native soil remaining faithful to the family's approach to the production of wine and their taste for 'territory'.

That said, Cabernet, Syrah and Merlot excel here too, developing character and personality with a Tuscan identity.

There's no science fiction involved in the winemaking here, the cellars contain only that which is strictly necessary and is utilized merely to draw forth the maximum which the soil has managed to transmit to the grapes.



Our own brand Villa Domiziano Chianti DOCG is produced using carefully selected Sangiovese and Merlot grapes harvested from hillside vineyards in the Chianti DOCG.

The grapes are fermented in stainless-steel fermenting tanks at controlled temperatures and then aged for another 10 months in cement vats before bottling and release. The resulting wine is bright ruby red in colour with a soft, velvety taste. Classic Chianti at a fantastic price.







Marche

Dating back to Etruscan times, Marche's wine making history has long been influenced both by its culture and its climate. Located in central Italy between the Apennine Mountains and the Adriatic Sea, the region has a number of terroirs which are suitable for grape cultivation. Clay and limestonerich soils contribute to this distinctive terroir and vary according to the changing topography. From the rolling coastal hills and the influence of the mountain chains and rivers, producers in Marche have both warm and cool climates to utilise.

The Marche's vineyards cover 25,000 hectares and produce almost two million hectolitres of wine annually. The majority of this is sold as table wine or under the title IGT Marche, with about 20% sold under the region's 15 DOC and 5 DOCG titles. The majority of DOC classifications in Marche cover both red and white wines.

Known primarily as a white-wine region, the amount of whites and reds produced in Marche are actually almost equal. The main regional white is Verdicchio, a dry, characteristically flavoured wine made from at least 85% of the grape with the same name. The Marche has grown the Verdicchio grape for over 600 years, with the finest expressions of the wine found in the DOCGs Verdicchio dei Castelli di Jesi and Verdicchio di Matelica. Among the red wines, the finest are typically made from Montepulciano and Sangiovese grapes, the most known wines from these being Rosso Conero and Rosso Piceno.

The Vicari winery is a small family company owned and operated by Nazzareno Vicari and his two children Vic and Valentina and was established in 1990, located in Morro D'Alba. Vicari follows the wines from the vineyard through all stages of the winemaking process, in search of the highest quality due to low yields per hectare creating their own unique character. In 2020 the company was further expanded to an area of 300 square metres, dedicated to wine storage at controlled temperatures and began the complete conversion of vineyards and olive groves to organic agriculture.



Umbria

With its central location, Umbria is one of the smallest regions of Italy and is considered to be home to some of the country's earliest inhabitants. Similar in climate to Tuscany, Umbria has cold, rainy winters and dry, sunny summers. The soils of the region are made up of calcareous clay and sand. Due to Umbria's hilly terrain, many vineyard plantings are done along terraces which are cut into the hillsides – hence the name 'colli' (translated into 'hill') seen in many of the region's DOC names.

Umbria's wine production is limited; it produces less than a third of neighbouring Tuscany, and is the fourth smallest wine producing region in Italy. What Umbria lacks in quantity, however, it makes up for in quality. Known primarily for its white wines, the Orvieto DOC is one of the best appreciated wines and accounts for 80% of overall wine production. Mostly found in the dry variety, in the town of Orvieto it can be found in the Abboccato (semi-sweet) variety.

While the region is most noted for its white wines, both of Umbria's DOCGs are for red wines. There are a total of 13 DOCs as well, and while there isn't a large percentage of a wine produced at DOC level, this is steadily on the rise. Investments in practice have allowed for many high-quality new wines such as Cabernet Sauvignons, Merlots, and Chardonnays to become available. Due to their affordable prices compared to similar wines in Tuscany, they have attracted considerable interest locally and internationally.

LUNGAROTTI

RADICI IN UMBRIA

Lungarotti



During the 1960s Giorgio Lungarotti planted the town of Torgiano, and indeed Umbria, firmly on the world wine landscape. The family name is today an icon of the region, and Italian wine making. Through the decades, Giorgio based the success of his business on a strong bond with his land and a search for quality, which also provided environmental sustainability. Lungarotti own 250 hectares of vineyards split between Torgiano and Montefalco. They implement innovative cultivation techniques based on sustainability and respect for the environment. Vine densities are optimised to increase competitiveness between plants, limit the production per vine and guarantee better grape quality. Careful vineyard management enables Lungarotti to favour accumulation and preservation of water resources, encouraging the roots to grow deeper into the soil as they search for water and nutritional elements, making the vines more resistant in case of drought. The Lungarotti wines are the centerpiece of their empire, alongside their prestigious tourist centre, wine museum, shops and wine bars - collectively, the estate is a stunning promotional tool not only for Lungarotti, but for the whole region. Today the company is run by sisters Chiara Lungarotti and Teresa Severini. Their commitment and openness to innovation have continued the strong ethos of Lungarotti - family stewardship as a guarantee not only of the present but also the future.

Lazio

Like many Italian wine regions, Lazio's (also known as 'Latium') heritage is ancient and dates back to Etruscan and Roman times. The city of Rome has shaped the region's viniculture for centuries, beginning with the improvements brought on by the Romans to the instatement of Rome as the capital in the 1870s.

Lazio is located in central Italy, and is home to volcanic hills which allow for fertile soils rich in potassium and well suited for the growth of grapes, especially white as they ensure a good balance of acidity. The cool breezes from the Tyrrhenian Sea help to balance the dry, warm temperatures on the coast. The Apennine Mountains protect the region from the cold winds coming from the north-east.

White wines are the most prominent in Lazio, making up 24 out of the 27 DOCs produced there. Due to modern vinification methods, the white wines there are light, dry and crisp, designed for drinking young. Red wines, though not as well-known, are beginning to develop a name for themselves as well.

Abruzzo

Abruzzo is located in central Italy, stretching from the Apennine Mountains to the Adriatic Sea. Although geographically central, it is sometimes considered part of Southern Italy given its historic association with Sicily. Winemaking dates back to the sixth century B.C. when the Etruscans introduced viniculture to the area.

The geographical makeup of Abruzzo ranges from rugged mountains, a long coastline, and lush forests that account for the abundant sunshine and rainfall, as well as varying climates which are ideal for grape growing. Due to the cool mountain air and varying daily temperatures, along with greater rainfall with increased altitude, grape vines flourish. The majority of vineyards are found in the hilly areas, which benefit from a range of calcareous clay soils as well as soils of iron and limestone mix.

In the last 40-50 years, Abruzzo has seen a revival in viniculture, with quality-driven and boutique wines becoming more prominent in recent times. Home to one DOCG and 8 DOCs, the native red Montepulciano and white Trebbiano dominate the grape varieties used in winemaking, with some influence by other native and some international varieties. In 2008, Tullum was named the first territorial DOC in Abruzzo. Also the smallest DOC in Italy, bottling is only allowed within the area of Tollo.

CANTINA TOLLO

Cantina Tollo



The Cantina Tollo co-operative was founded in 1960. It has 620 members and 2,500 hectares of vineyards. Although predominantly specialising in indigenous grape varieties, Cantina Tollo have recently planted Chardonnay, Pinot Grigio, Merlot and Cabernet.

The co-operative has developed into the impressive entity it is today because from the outset the founding members dedicated themselves

to quality. Over the last few decades, Cantina Tollo have worked tirelessly and invested substantially to improve the quality of the grapes and subsequently the wines they produce.

Tollo now produces over 15 million bottles of wine and exports throughout the globe.

For quality, notably Tre Bicchieri at the Gambero Rosso for the Mo', Montepulciano d'Abruzzo Riserva 2017 to 2021.

Campania

Campania, located in southern Italy, is known for its stunning coasts and rich history as it is one of the oldest Italian regions. Shaped by the influence of the Greeks, Romans, and Byzantines, many grape varieties are linked to historical legends. Campania is also famous for producing Falerno, which is one of the most ancient wines in Italy.

The varied climates and terroirs in Campania account for approximately 46,800 hectares of vines grown in the region. Hot, dry summers, mild winters, abundant sunshine, and rich volcanic soil allow for a long growing season. Additionally, the cool breezes from the Tyrrhenian Sea help to temper the heat, which encourages balanced acidity in the grapes. Traditionally, wines in the region display fruity, youthful styles, are intended for immediate consumption and require little ageing.

Campania is home to over 100 native grape varieties, including Fiano which was used by the Romans, Greco and Aglianico, first introduced by the Greeks. These native grapes are essential in the making of the regions DOCG and DOC classifications. Because of improved harvesting methods and cellar techniques there has been an increase in the amount of DOC wines produced over the last few decades. Both red and white varieties have become more notable and are very highly regarded.

Sella delle Spine is a family owned winery in Taurasi, Irpinia - a region in Campania which is famous for its Aglianico grape. The winery was founded in 1970 by the Caggiano family with deep rooted wine traditions of Irpinia and the production of high quality wines made from estate grown grapes that have been recognised internationally with multiple awards for authenticity, elegance and depth. The name Sella delle Spine is inspired by the natural shape of the land , which is unusual for the for the area which resembles a horses saddle a natural amphitheatre that emabraces the vineyards bordered by roses that grow between the vines. The winery focusses on natural sustainable practices respecting the natural wine making process, with each vineyard with its own soil composition and microclimate. Since 2022, the estate has been officially certified in Italy as certified organic and also showing commitment to sustainability and biodiversity in Irpinia. Today Luigi Caggiano and his children continue their commitment to Sella delle Spine producing distinctive wines from the unique surrounding terroir, combining respect for tradition with a forward looking approach.

The Campania Regional Authority identified the Piano d'Angelo district as one of the most highly suited areas for quality viticulture and awarded the Taurasi DOCG status in 1992. Luigi and Maria Caggiano established one of the first experimental vineyards dedicated to the production of Taurasi, which remains the cradle of the regions most iconic cru at the Sella Delle Spine winery - Taurasi DOCG 'Vigna Piano d'Angelo'.

Puglia

Puglia, or Apulia, is located at the south-eastern tip of the Italian peninsula and forms the "heel" of the Italian boot. Consisting of broad plains and low-lying hills, it is the least mountainous region in Italy. The region shows cultural and geographical differences in the north and the south; while the north is slightly hillier and more connected to the customs and winemaking practices of central Italy, the south is completely flat and maintains its strong connection to its Greco-Roman heritage.

The hot, dry Mediterranean climate found in Puglia, coupled with frequent sunshine and occasional breezes from the Adriatic Sea allow for near-perfect grape-growing conditions. While there are not many rivers to be found in the region, its limestone foundation is permeated by rainfall and gives way to underground watercourses that hydrate the iron-rich soils.

Puglia produces the most wine out of the Italian regions, typically making up about 17% of the national total. Wine was originally mass-produced in the region, though modern consumers began to demand quality over quantity and as such, DOCG and DOC produced wine has risen steadily. Grapes unique to the area are grown in the south, which is seen by some as the "true" Puglia. Red varieties, especially those made with Negroamaro, dominate the region's DOC classifications.



LEONE DE CASTRIS

Leone de Castris



The Leone de Castris winery is based in Salice Salentino and is an intrinsic part of the history of wine-making in the Southern Italian region of Puglia.

The estate was founded in 1665 by Duke Oronzo, Earl of Lemos. After being enchanted by the landscape of Puglia he decided to sell all his properties in Spain, and dedicated himself to making great wine from the rich terroir of Salento.

He began by planting new vines, olive trees and wheat on the 5,000 hectares of property which spanned Salice, Guagnano, Veglie, Villa Baldassarri, Novoli and San Pancrazio.

"Five Roses", the now famous rosé made by Leone de Castris, was first produced in 1943, and was the first rosato to be bottled in Italy. Its name comes from a "contrada" (neighbourhood), belonging to the family, so called, because for several generations each de Castris had five children.

During the 1960s, the direction of the company was in the hands of Cavaliere del Lavoro Salvatore Leone de Castris, and thanks to his efforts the winery developed both locally and internationally.

The philosophy of continuous improvement is now driven on by his son, Piernicola Leone de Castris, who has been Managing Director since the late 1990's.

Leone de Castris have always been pioneers in spreading the richness of Salento's viticulture all over the world. With 350 years of history, they are looking towards the future.

Sardinia

Sardinia is a large island off the western coast of mainland Italy, and is the second largest in the Mediterranean other than Sicily. As an autonomous region that is situated a considerable distance from the other Italian regions, it has developed its own distinct culture and identity. Winemaking is not a historic part of Sardinian culture as it has been in the rest of Italy, and the wines produced there bear little resemblance to those from the other regions.

The terroir in Sardinia is very well suited to viniculture. There is much topographical diversity and climate variation between the hills, plains, and coastal regions. Additionally, the nutrients in the soils vary from mineral-rich clays to free-draining sands with bedrocks of granite, limestone, and sandstone. Many of the grapes grown in the region have French and Spanish origins, or are varieties exclusive to the region. Some of these varieties, such as Nuragus and Monica, feature their own DOCs.

Only a small portion of Sardinia's land is devoted to grapevines, though Italian wine authorities are working to develop the island's wine potential. Sardinia currently has the lowest wine production per hectare of any wine region, but some producers are creating high-quality wines that are recognised on a wider scale. The majority of vineyards in the region lie to the west where most of the DOCs are also found, however Vermentino di Gallura DOCG (one of four white DOCGs in Italy) is produced in the north east of Sardinia.

The renowned oenologist Professor Giacomo Tachis, who sadly passed away in February 2016, was involved with the winery for over a decade and is responsible for creating Turriga, which is today considered to be one of Italy's best red wines. The Argiolas winery has always preferred to concentrate on indigenous Sardinian

grape varieties, and they are responsible for a resurgence of interest in Bovale Sardo.

The estate comprises 230 hectares and is located in Serdiana. Trexenta and Sulcis.












Italy sicily





Sicily

Sicily is an autonomous region of Italy, and the largest island in the Mediterranean Sea. The region has been significant in winemaking for over 2500 years and boasts near perfect growing conditions. There is consistent sunshine, moderate rainfall, and a hilly landscape which provides an ideal terroir for wine-bearing grape vines. Mount Etna, which is Europe's tallest active volcano, is responsible for the mineral-rich, volcanic soils that dominate the area to the east.

Sicily has more vineyards than any other Italian region, and competes with Puglia for the largest wine producer. Vineyards in the east of Sicily are now planted high up on the volcanic slopes so as to take advantage of the cool air and rich soils present there. To the west the volcanic hills may not be as dramatic, but still influence the soil types.

In recent years, quality-focused attitudes have led to Sicilian winemakers producing better wines that have gained more notice internationally. Many grapes grown in Sicily are made into raisins and used in cooking, or used in creating dessert wines. Dessert wines are renowned in Sicily, in particular the famous Marsala wine. In fact, 90% of all DOC production in the region is made up of dessert wines. Red and white wines are also respected as well, including natives Nero d'Avola and Grecanico.

From day one, the philosophy behind Cusumano has been to emphasise the importance of terroir.

Cusumano was established in 2000 when brothers Alberto and Diego took over from their father, who had been growing grapes for 40 years. The estate comprised 140 hectares of prime vineyard locations throughout Sicily which, within recent years, has grown to 502 hectares.

In 2004, they expanded again with the acquisition of a new holding in San Giacomo, in the territory of Buttera, to the south of the island. The brothers have assembled a team that has a rich experience in viticulture and above all an absolute passion for winemaking.

Because of their intimate knowledge of the Sicilian terroir, Diego and Alberto have been able to find prime vineyard locations throughout Sicily.

These vineyards allow maximum expression of not only indigenous Sicilian grape varieties but of international varietals that, according to Diego, evolve to take on their own Sicilian identity.

The Cusumano family have invested heavily in technology, and have fully renovated the old cantina to create a state of the art winery built around the ancient baglio.

France competes only with Italy as the largest wine producing country in the world, producing over 50 to 60 million hectolitres of wines (or 7 to 8 billion bottles) per year.

The Domaine de Oliveira Lecestre estate, a family concern born in 1955, is situated in Fontenay-près-Chablis, in the north-east of the Chablis region, on the right bank of the Serein River.

For the first ten or so years the founder, Mr De Oliveira, worked for neighbouring winegrowers while tending his own vineyards at the same time.

In 1965 he decided to focus exclusively on his estate of 7 hectares, and went into partnership with his brother-in-law, Mr Lecestre, in order to expand. They continued to increase the size of the estate, planting vines, investing in new buildings and buying high-clearance tractors to improve productivity and facilitate work in the vineyard.

In 1997 Mr De Oliveira took well-deserved retirement and his daughter took over the running of the business. Her father remains active on the estate where his advice is always welcomed. In 2004 his granddaughter joined the team, making the third generation to date to work on the estate.

There are currently 48 hectares of vines, spread across the four Chablis denominations: 8.44 hectares of Petit Chablis, 34.99 hectares of Chablis, 4.29 hectares of Chablis Premier Cru and 0.28 hectares of Chablis Grand Cru.

Domaine la Colombe rosé is a part of AOP Coteaux Varois en Provence wines. Located in the commune of Saint-Maximin-la-Sainte-Baume, the area covers approximatelly 30 hectares. The altitude of the vineyards varies somewhere between 360 and 420 meters above sea level. The soil is largely clay and limestone in the valleys. Most areas under cultivation are composed of bauxite, sand and marble especially in those areas adjacent to Sainte Victoire.

The wines from this region are mainly produced by bleeding process of the grapes.

The rose has a grapefruit pink color. On the nose, a touch of brioche, fermentation stands out on the aromas of young fruits. The palate is clean, pretty, and well-balanced with a nice freshness on the finish.





The Costières de Pomerols Co-operative enjoys an enviable position overlooking the 'Etang de Thau', a salt water lagoon beside the Mediterranean town of Séte.

Comprising of 400 winegrowers the company holds a total of 1,750 hectares including 420 classified as AOC Picpoul de Pinet.

The Guillaume de Guers Picpoul has an upbeat freshness, lemony zing and a subtle floral whiff of ripe, juicy pears. Bone-dry, crisp fruit and zippy acidity in balance.



South Africa

Generally thought to be one of the world's most beautiful wine regions, South Africa must also win awards for the most diverse topography and and maximised by South African winegrowers. Here, sustainability alongside quality is keenly protected. Today South Africa exports around 450 million litres of wine with over 100,000 hectares of vineyard and is the 9th largest producer of wine in the world. The top five grape varieties in South Africa are Chenin Blanc, Cabernet Sauvignon, Colombard, Shiraz and Sauvignon Blanc. Chenin Blanc is still king in South Africa, although around 40% of vineyards were replanted in recent years and there is a notable shift from 80% white grapes to a split that is nearly 50/50 red and white. Despite its African geography, the Cape winelands, situated at the Southernmost tip of Africa, enjoy a Mediterranean climate with cool, wet winters and warm dry summers. The mountain slopes and valleys form the ideal habitat for the wine grape, Vitis Vinifera, and the sea breezes from during the warm summer afternoons, slowing the ripening process and creating the intense fruit flavours that are so popular with lovers of South African wines.

Australia

Vines first arrived to the world's largest island in 1788 and today Australia has more than 420,000 acres under vine producing more than 1.46 billion bottles of wine per year. The principal wine regions in Australia by volume are South Australia, New South Wales and Victoria with by far the largest area of wine production being South Australia. Shiraz holds the title of main grape of Australia with Chardonnay now the second most planted variety. Today however there are more than 100 different grape varieties planted throughout Australia including among others; Pinot Gris, Riesling, Viognier, Tempranillo and Sangiovese. Recently, wine styles here are changing dramatically too with a move by winemakers towards expressing the rich terroir of the country, producing 'artisan' style wines. In terms of climate, much of Australia is far too hot for vine cultivation so vineyards are principally located along the slightly cooler coastline to the South of the country.



New Zealand

New Zealand extends 1,600km (1000 miles) from sub-tropical Northland (36° S) to the world's most southerly grape growing region Central Otago (47° S). Vineyards benefit from the moderating effect of the maritime climate (no vineyard is more than 120km, or 80 miles, from the ocean) with long sunshine hours and nights cooled by sea breezes. New Zealand wine is distinctive for its purity, vibrancy and intensity. The long ripening period - a result of cool temperatures allows flavour development whilst retaining fresh acidity, a balance for which New Zealand wines are renowned. New Zealand produces less than 1% of the world's wine and is largely produced in ten major wine growing regions. They are, from north to south Northland, Auckland, Waikato/Bay of Plenty, Gisborne, Hawke's Bay, Wellington, Nelson, Marlborough, Canterbury/Waipara and Central Otago. New Zealand is home to what many wine critics consider the world's best Sauvignon Blanc. Oz Clarke, a well-known British wine critic, wrote in the 1990s that New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc was "arguably the best in the world".



Chile

Vines were first brought to Chile by the Spanish Conquistadors in the mid 1500's. Since Independence, the country has maintained a thriving wine industry, initially for its domestic market and since the mid-1980s with rapid development as a strong export market. Chile has enviable climate conditions that are ideal for grape growing; hot summers, coastal cooling breezes, a coastal mountain range, protecting many vines from ocean dampness, and a moderate rainfall.

Today, Chile is the 5th largest exporter of wines in the world and the 7th largest wine producer. In the past few decades this could be attributed to the consistent quality and price offered by classic grape varieties (Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Sauvignon Blanc and Chardonnay) which thrive in the Central Valley and, in part, to the discovery of the near extinct grape, Carménère.

However, more recently Chilean winemakers have been experimenting with the notion of 'Terroir'; by seeking out lesser-known regions, playing with the influence of micro-climates, cool climate production, variety and clonal selection and viticultural techniques.



Conditions of Sale

- Definitions
- 1.1 The "Seller" means Eurowines Limited
- 1.2 The "Buyer" is the person or company buying the Goods under these terms and conditions.
- 1.3 The "Goods" means the goods which are to be sold under a contract of sale between the Seller and the Buyer.
- 2 Formation of Contract
- 2.1 These conditions shall apply to all contracts between the Seller and the Buyer to the exclusion of all other terms and conditions.
- 2.2 All orders shall be deemed to be an offer by the Buyer to purchase Goods pursuant to these conditions. Acceptance of Goods at delivery shall be deemed conclusive evidence of acceptance of these conditions.
- 3 Prices
- 3.1 Prices involved will be those ruling at the date of despatch of the Goods.
- 3.2 Subject to Clause 3.1, all quoted prices are subject to change without notice
- 3.3 All prices are quoted duty paid and delivered and exclusive of value added tax which will be charged at the rate in force at the time of despatch of the Goods.
- 3.4 All orders are in multiples of an unmixed case. A minimum order value of £250 Nett Sales Value (or 4×9 litre cases) is in operation in London and a minimum order value of £400 Nett Sales Value (or 6×9 litre cases for the rest of the UK Mainland . Any order below these values will be subject to a delivery charge.
- 4 Terms of Payment
- 4.1 If the Buyer has not opened a credit account in accordance with the Sellers terms payment for all orders shall be required in cleared funds before the Goods are despatched.
- 4.2 If the Seller has a current credit account with the Seller then payment terms shall be as agreed in writing and set out in the credit account application approved by the Seller as may be varied in writing by the Seller or if no such terms have been agreed no later than 30 days from the end of the month in which the Goods are delivered to the Buyer and in either event in full without set off or counterclaim. Time for payment is of the essence.
 - In the event of non-payment of any sum due to the Seller by the due date all sums owing to the Seller by the Buyer shall immediately become due.
- 4.3 The Seller reserves the right to charge interest on unpaid invoices and any other sums due to the Seller and outstanding at a daily rate of 3% per annum above base rate of Barclays Bank Plc from time to time from the date when payment becomes due until the date when payment is made and interest will accrue after as well as before any judgment. The Buyer will reimburse the Seller for all costs and expenses (including legal costs on an indemnity basis) incurred in the collection of any overdue amount.
- 4.4 Without prejudice to any rights which the Seller may have in the event of non-payment of any sums outstanding on the due date, the Seller shall have the right to cease supplying other Goods ordered by the Buyer from the Seller whether under this contract or any other.
- 5 Delivery
- 5.1 Time and dates quoted for delivery are estimates only and the time for delivery of the Goods shall not be of the essence.
- 5.2 Where delivery is made by instalments, delay in delivering one or more instalments shall not entitle the Buyer to refuse to accept any remaining instalments.

- 5.3 The Buyer shall not refuse to accept delivery of any consignment or instalment on account of any shortage or defect in any other delivery.
- 5.4 Delivery takes place when the Goods are delivered to the ground floor entrance of the building of the Buyer's premises as stated in the order.
- 5.5 The Seller shall not be liable in any way for any losses, damages or expenses (whether direct, indirect or consequential) suffered by the Buyer due to any delay in failure in delivering the Goods.
- 5.6 Without prejudice to any other rights which the Seller may have, where the Buyer does not accept delivery of the Goods a transport and delivery charge equal to 15% of the nett order value of the nett accepted Goods shall be payable by the Buyer to the Seller.
- 6 Short Delivery/Wrong Product Delivered/Non-Delivery
- 6.1 No claims for shortage, for damage to Goods or for delivery of wrong products shall be made unless the Seller is notified in writing quoting number of delivery note or invoice number within 24 hours after the time of delivery in accordance with Clause 5 and in the absence of such notification the Buyer shall be deemed to have accepted the Goods and payment in full will become due in accordance with the terms of 6.2 Clause 4.
- No claims for non-delivery shall be made unless the Seller is notified in writing within 7 days of the date of invoice. In the absence of such notification, the Seller shall be deemed to have delivered the Goods
- 7 and payment in full become due in accordance with Clause 4.
- 7.1 Damage in Transit
 - Goods damaged in transit must be reported to the Seller immediately by signing the delivery note "damaged on arrival". This must be returned to the Seller within 24 hours of the time of delivery. Any damaged Goods must be retained (including wrappings, cartons etc)
- In the event that the delivery note was signed but not marked "damaged on arrival" the Seller cannot be held responsible for damages
- 8 in transit
- 8.1 Return of Goods
- Goods cannot be accepted for return without the prior consent of the 8.2 Seller which will be given at the Seller's discretion.
- 8.3 A handling charge of 15% of nett order value will be made on all Goods.
- 8.4 Any Goods returned in accordance with this clause 8, must be in pristine condition and returned correctly packed in its original packing.
 Risk in any Goods to be returned remains with the Buyer until the
- Goods are delivered to the Seller or until the Seller collects such
- 9.1 Goods.
 - Quality of Goods
 - Save as expressly provided, all warranties and conditions relating to quality, or compliance with description (whether implied by statute or otherwise) are hereby excluded to the extent permitted by law PRO-
- 10 VIDED THAT nothing in these conditions shall restrict or exclude liabil-
- 10.1 ity for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Seller. Inability to Supply

Without prejudice to any other condition hereof if any product shall not be available at the Sellers UK warehouse or should the despatch or delivery of the whole or any part of the Goods be interrupted, prevented or hindered by any cause or causes whatsoever beyond the Seller's control, the Seller shall be entitled to postpone or suspend any delivery or deliveries until (in the Seller's reasonable judgment)

- any such clause has ceased to operate. The Seller shall be under no liability whatsoever in respect of such postponement or suspension.
- 10.2 If the Seller does not apply to supply any Goods due to its unavailability at its warehouse or if despatch or delivery is delayed for more than one week, the Seller has the option of cancelling the contract and refunding any payment made by the Buyer.
- 11 Product Changes
- 11.1 Vintage wines are subject to change. When a vintage changes then next available vintage will be supplied.
- 12 Retention of Title
- 12.1 Risk in the Goods shall pass to the Buyer on delivery and the Buyer shall insure the goods with a reputable insurance company against all risks for their full value from that time.
- 12.2 Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 12.1, property and ownership in the Goods shall not pass from the Seller until:
- 12.2.1 the Buyer shall have paid the Seller for the goods; and
- 12.2.2 no other sums are then outstanding from the Buyer to the Seller on any account whatever whether or not such sums have become due for payment.
- 12.3 Until property in the Goods passes to the Buyer, the Buyer shall:-
- 12.3.1 Hold the Goods as the Seller's fiduciary agent and bailee;
- 12.3.2 store the Goods separately from those of any other person and ensure they are readily identifiable as the property of the Seller.
- 12.4 Notwithstanding the provisions of this clause, the Buyer may as principal in the ordinary course of its business sell the Goods for market value or use the Goods in the ordinary course of its business but shall account to the Seller for the proceeds of sale or otherwise of the Goods, whether tangible or intangible, including insurance proceeds, and shall keep all such proceeds separate from any monies or property of the Buyer and third parties and, in the case of tangible proceeds, properly stored, protected and insured.
- 12.5 At any time prior to property in the Goods passing to the Buyer, in the event of :-
- 12.5.1 the Buver's insolvency:
- 12.5.2 the Buyer's failure to pay any amount due to the Seller; or
- 12.5.3 any breach by the Buyer of these conditions the Buyer must immediately place any Goods in its possession or under its control at the Seller's disposal and the Seller's representatives shall have (without prejudice to any of the Seller's other rights and remedies) the right to enter the Buyer's premises retake possession of such goods. In such event, the Buyer shall procure that the Seller has access to the premises of any third parties where Goods in which property has not yet passed to the Buyer are stored.
- 12.6 Should any event listed in Clause 12.5 occur, the Buyer's right to sell and to use the Goods shall immediately cease.
- 13 Miscellaneous
- 13.1 The contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with English law and the parties hereto submit to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.
